Tim,

My experience using the HexSite has been very positive. In my work here in southern Arizona as a U.S. Border Patrol Agent, I have had to draw my issued firearm and hold people at gun point for a few seconds up to a few minutes and I have attempted to transfer the techniques you teach over to my service firearm. I do wish we could have the HexSite mounted on our service firearm. Being able to look at, or perhaps better stated, to look through to the target is, in my opinion, a lot safer. One can see what the suspect is doing and not a blurred image of what they are doing. It would also allow me to keep a greater awareness of what is going on around me and what is behind the suspect, i.e. tertiary targets. It would allow me to make a better decision on whether I can or should shoot given the particular circumstances.

I am much faster acquiring targets with proper sight alignment with the HexSite than I am with my service firearm. The HexSite is just more conducive to having the sights aligned when drawing to aim quickly without having to keep reminding yourself front sight, front sight, front sight, etc.... All the while you need to see what the suspect is doing. Speed to target acquisition and sight alignment, for the few people that have used my Commander with the HexSite, they have said is far superior to the post and notch. And that is with the little instruction that I gave them.

Though I was not able to use the HexSite while in the U.S. Border Patrol Academy, I believe that the concept of the HexSite and the training that you gave me helped me finish in the top two in my class in the PPC, as well as performing well in the

Shoot/No Shoot Simulations.

I want to thank you for your time and patience in my training,, and for inventing such a great tool for those of us who want to better our performance in Pistolcraft.
