Thanks for being on the cutting edge! I believe that your Hexsite system is not just a break with tradition and "conventional wisdom". It is based upon lifesaving principle and technique. Something, in my opinion, overdue.

As a police officer for the past 16 years, I've become very familiar with the conventional and traditional post and notch sight systems. I've also been raised on focusing on the front sight and developing a good sight picture method of shooting. This has always worked well for my target and qualification shooting needs.

As a former member of U.S. Army Special Forces, I'm also well schooled and experienced in the need for unconventional tactics and techniques. I also know that in close quarter combat, as most jungle fighting and officer involved shootings are, "point" or "combat" shooting techniques prevail. In the moment of life or death, the threat becomes the focus of attention. That principle is what interested me most with your new sight design. The idea that focusing on the target or threat is primary and that looking through the HexSite which draws the eye to it intrigued me. The more I thought about it, especially given my profession, the more it made sense to me. Of course, "the proof is always on the range".

Upon receiving my Beretta 96F with the new sights installed, I was immediately impressed with the sleek beauty of the design. As I showed my newly equipped weapon to the cops in the shop, the overwhelming response after bringing the gun up to point was "Interesting, it's there every time".

The real test my rangemaster and I were interested in was performance. After firing several hundred rounds from 7-25 yds., it became apparent to me that I was shooting tighter groups on paper and overall performance with metal plates improved. My double taps

were crisp and on target. Failure drills, especially the head shots, were consistent and effective. We were impressed!

Your sights have certainly created a ground swell of interest here and I'm glad I can carry them with me everyday on the job. Thanks again for your creative wisdom and courage.
