Dear Tim,

I am writing this letter to you, concerning your HexSite. Your idea and research has concluded with your receiving five patents, which led to the manufacturing of your site. Your sight is a first of a kind, remarkable and the state-of-art sighting system that WORKS, especially under stressful situations. With my military background and my twenty-seven years in law enforcement training and experience, I know this is the sight for both. I include below my military and law enforcement experience and dates of service.

I want to see this sight installed on all military weapons that it is suitable for, along with police agency duty weapons, shotguns and rifles. I have used your sight and it works. As you know, the Warren Police Department in New Jersey, under the command of Chief William J. Stahl, where I was once the Chief of Police (1980-1983), has adopted your sighting system for their duty weapons department-wide. Also, two members of the Somerset County SWAT team in New Jersey use the HexSite. I can see in the near future, the word spreading and more prosecutors, police chiefs, administrators and rank-and-file will have hands-on experience with the HexSite.

I have heard comments in the law enforcement community, who want you to send them a sight so they may install it on their weapon. Well, it's just not that easy. This HexSite is a unique sight that requires a bit of understanding (natural mindset in combat) for the proper use and also the installation. This can be completed by training personnel and armorers, but they must be properly informed, which is not a lengthy process. The retraining is simple. This is not traditional target shooting; IT IS a natural instinctive fighting response.

I have your sights on all of my personal weapons and find them to work extremely well during the daytime and at night. Through the years in law enforcement, I have tried all the new sight products that have come on the market, from a peep sight, dots to laser sights (\$600.00), very costly. When I was introduced to the HexSite (five years ago) and actually used it in the field, I was sold on it, and all of my weapons you have converted. The results of the HexSite system on a Remington 870 while firing slugs is unbelievable, to say the least. Last, but not least, the HexSites on my 191 Is are second to none.

In 1966-67 in my infantry unit 40K northwest of Pleiku along the Ho Chi Minh Trail, I would have felt much more comfortable with your HexSite on my M-16.
